ELIGIBILITY: As approved by the National Rifle Association Rule 1.6 F, May 2018 or current NRA Rulebook

RULES: Current NRA Precision Pistol Rules (2018 or most current) will govern.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Individuals who have not been classified will fire in the Master Class, Rule 19.6 (Assigned Classifications may be used.)

CATEGORIES & CLASSES IN INDIVIDUAL MATCHES:

Separate class awards will be given in each of the (3) categories: Civilian, Service, and Police subject to the conditions of the award schedule. Members of the active Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, and National Guard and Reserve components will make up the Service Category. Members of Federal, State, County, Municipal law enforcement groups and Industrial Police comprise the Police Category. All others will be considered Civilians (Rule 2.2).

- 1) If there are less than five entries in any category within a class, they will be combined with other entries in another category within the same class.
- 2) If there are less than five entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be NO AWARDS provided in that class and all competitors in the lower class will be moved to their respective category in the next higher class.
- 3) If the five competitor minimum required for award purposes has still not been fulfilled, competitors will be moved in class and category until there are five or more in a class and category, EXCEPT HIGH MASTER. A class or category will not be combined downward. If there are less than 5 High Masters, they will compete for MATCH WINNER only.

CHALLENGES: A challenge fee of \$3.00 will be charged for each challenge made. See NRA Rule book for correct procedure.

Two Relays will be offered to allow shooters to shoot both Service EIC and Distinguished Revolver.

EIC Match Program Service Pistol & CMP .22 Rimfire Pistol

Eligibility: Open to all eligible participants. You need not be a member of the NRA or a CMP affiliated club to participate

Course of Fire: For Service Pistol EIC and CMP .22 Rim Fire EIC Pistol is the 30 shot National Match Course of Fire (see rule 7.3.1 Table 5, page 44).

Firearm: "Service Pistol," ".22 Rimfire Pistol" as defined in the Current Edition of the CMP Service Rulebook (see rule 6.3, Table 3 (pages 32-37), rule 6.4 (page 37) or rule 6.1 Table 2 (pages 28-32).

Entries: List the number of entries accepted or make note, there must be at least six non-distinguished shooters. Non-Distinguished shooters will get priority.

Awards: Gold, Silver & Bronze Achievement Pins will be presented to competitors (Distinguished or Non-Distinguished), in CMP-Sanctioned EIC Matches, that equal or exceed Achievement Award Scores. <u>Points</u> – Points are given to any non-distinguished shooters who place in the top ten percent of non-distinguished shooters, provided that the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC Minimum Credit Score (Rule, 9.2.7). Calculations are based on rule 9.2.6. All Points are issued by the CMP.

<u>Minimum EIC Scores</u> – To receive EIC credit points, the score fired by the competitor must fulfill the requirements of Rule 9.2.6 (top 10%) and equal or exceed the EIC Minimum Credit Score (MCS) for that discipline (see CMP Rule 9.2.7). MCS scores are:

- Service Pistol. 250 x 300
- .22 Rimfire Pistol, 260 x 300

Rules: In accordance with the current edition of the CMP Service Rulebook. All Service Pistol EIC Matches, CMP .22 Rimfire EIC Pistol Matches will be governed by CMP rules.

NRA DISTINGUISHED REVOLVER Match Program

Eligibility: Any competitor who is eligible under rule 2.0 of the NRA Pistol Rules. Range Officers may rule juniors ineligible if they feel the junior is physically unable to safely handle an appropriate revolver with legal ammunition. Competitors are no longer required to shoot the 2700 in order to shoot this match.

Course of Fire: The course of fire is the 30 shot National Match Course of Fire.

Firearm: Double Action Revolver capable of safely firing .38 Special ammunition as described in NRA Precision Pistol Rules Section 3.3 (2018). Revolvers must be double action capable, have minimum 2-1/2 lb. trigger pull, symmetrical grips, iron sights, a maximum 6-1/2" barrel length and use allowable ammunition as listed below.

Ammunition: Any safe .38 caliber ammunition using 158 grain round nose or semi-wadcutter lead bullets only. See NRA Precision Pistol Rules Section 3.3(e) (2018)

Entries: Entries will be accepted up to the range capacity for two relays when combined with Service Pistol EIC shooters. Note that there must be at least six non-distinguished shooters. Non-Distinguished shooters will get priority.

Awards: Credit toward the NRA Distinguished Revolver Badge. Points will be awarded by the NRA per Rule 23.3 of the NRA Precision Pistol Rule Book 2018.
