RANGE SAFETY

Each range is designed for certain firearms. For safety reasons it is essential that only the designated firearms be used. Refer to the individual range rules for each range.

Arrange your firing point so that you fire straight downrange (do not fire diagonally across any range) and be sure that all shots impact the backstop. Firing is permitted **ONLY ON THE DESIGNATED RANGES** and is forbidden elsewhere on the property.

Do not shoot at trash. CRC has the finest competition ranges in the state and we strive to maintain the high standards for all our ranges.

COMPETITIONS

The competitive season has started in earnest with the recent Smallbore Regional and the NRA Pistol Regional, both held early in June. The results of all competitions are displayed on the web site under the Match Results tab.

The NRA registered Smallbore Regional tournament was fired on the weekend of June 3rd & 4th. After 320 rounds fired for record, club member Adrian of Boulder was match winner with a score of 3183-210x. He also was awarded a leg toward Smallbore Distinguished Rifleman.

PROJECT APPLESEED

Project Appleseed™ has a new Match Director, Alice Levin. This is a non-partisan group of men and women volunteers who are committed to upholding the values and principles of America's founding fathers. We use rifle marksmanship instruction as a gateway to help bring our nation's history to life and to show that many of the values that our forefathers relied on to win our independence are still very much in demand today.

Through clinics and events, we teach rifle marksmanship and early American heritage to introduce individuals of all skill levels to the knowledge that was so crucial to the success of our nation's founders. Aside from the fun and camaraderie of these events, the designed takeaway is a renewed sense of civic responsibility that each attendee can then implement in his or her own community.

Our clinics at Colorado Rifle Club provide in-depth instruction to students in shooting from the prone, seated or kneeling, and standing position. All positions are taught utilizing the student's own rifle and a GI-style web sling or similar style fabric slings. Most of our shooting takes place at 25 meters using reduced scale targets down to a simulated 400 meter silhouette, however, special "Known Distance" or "KD" events are hosted at CRC and other long distance ranges which take the skills learned at 25 meters out to 500 meters or more. Shooters of all experience levels will find the shooting challenging but highly rewarding.

While most participants use a magazine-fed .22LR or .223 rifle throughout the weekend, we see everything from tube-fed, lever-action .22 rifles up to the iconic M1 Garand on our firing line. With an average of 350 rounds fired per student over the course of two long days outside, many students find a rimfire rifle may be the more economical choice and a bit less physically demanding. A reliable .22LR magazine fed semiautomatic rifle with peep-aperture style sights or a modest scope is the most common type of rifle we see at our events.

Project Appleseed™ is served by more than 650 volunteers and has taught more than 70,000 people in all 50 states since 2006. The organization exists solely because of the dedication of our volunteers, and we are always looking for more individuals or families to support our mission as instructors or members of AppleCore. The AppleCore is comprised of individuals who provide administrative support at shoots, score targets, share stories of the men and women who founded our nation and assist with Range Safety Officer duties. Our instructors are the foundation upon which Project Appleseed is built, and the standards they must meet are designed to ensure they provide the highest quality instruction to all students. In order to become an Instructor in Training, an individual must be at least 13 years of age, attend at least two Project Appleseed™ shooting clinics, and score Rifleman on the challenging Appleseed Qualifying Test (AQT).
