Sponsored by the New Mexico Tech Shooting Sports Club and the Socorro Gun Club

Directions to the range: New Mexico Tech Gym basement classroom 1, New Mexico Tech Campus, Socorro, NM.

Competition is open to all junior competitors.

Entry fee: Juniors \$10.00. Three-man teams \$10.00/team.

Advanced entries are preferred. Firing times can be arranged by calling Virginia McLemore in Socorro (575-835-3823). Entries accepted on match day up to range capacity. Friday relays are 5 and 7. Saturday Relays are at 10:00, 12:00, 2:00.

The course of fire will consist of: 75 minutes for 40 shots, offhand, one shot per bull. Official NRA Target AR-5/10.

Any air rifle (rule Rule 3.6), metallic sights (Rule 3.7). Distance is 10 meters (33 feet). Coaching is not allowed.

Current NRA International Air Rifle rules apply.

Rifle: Rule 3.6, Air Rifle.

Sights: Rule 3.7, Metallic only.

Sighting Shots: Rule 9.2.

NRA classification will be used. **Individual Categories** (*Only one category may be entered*)

Junior: Born 1992, 1993, 1994 or later

Intermediate Junior: Born 1995, 1996 1997 or later

Sub-Junior: Born 1998 or later

Military Scholastic Active member of a high school JROTC unit or enrolled in a military high school. NRA Rule 2.9.1.

Team Matches - Open to any club who meets the eligibility requirements of NRA Rule 2.3 and 2.11(a). Individuals may fire on only one team per sectional. Awards: Ribbons and trophies for each class.

Team Entries: The team match is **not** a fired match (Paper Match). Team entry cards must have the names of all team members and alternate listed, and be submitted to the entry office **before** any member of the team begins individual match firing. An alternate may be named and substituted for any named team member as long as it is before either person has fired. (Rule 12.4).

Anyone may elect to shoot scope both days. On Saturday, they will compete in an any sight class and on Sunday they will be placed in their respective class. Competitors who choose scope only will not be eligible for State Champion.

There will be a team match on Saturday afternoon, weathering permitting (\$5.00). Two members each and will fire the Dewar (50 m and 100 yd).

Everyone must comply with all Park rules and with instructions of the ASRP Manager and staff.

Dates - October 1, November 5, December 3, January 7, February 4, March 3, April 7, May 5

Location - Albuquerque Shooting Range Park, (505-836-8785) Take exit 149 from I-40, go north about 4 miles to turnoff to ASRP, follow pavement west until you reach the range.

Time - Registration begins at 0900. Firing starts at 0930.

Registration Procedure - First, sign in at the Range Office and pay the Park fee (separate from league fees). Print your name on the back of your receipt. The match director will collect receipts. Second, pick up a target frame. Come to the 100 yard range immediately east of the range house for the match.

Fee - Match fee is \$1. There is no league fee. SGC membership not required.

Insurance – SGC members are covered by the Club’s insurance. Non-members pay an additional one dollar (\$1.00) per match fee to register as a SGC “match member.”

Rules - Current NRA Metric Smallbore Prone rifle rules will apply (league is not NRA approved).

Additionally, an F-Class or Unlimited Rifle category has been created, though scores fired by shooters in this unsanctioned category will not be turned in to the NRA, and they will not compete directly with shooters using complying equipment. Any safe .22 caliber rimfire rifle may enter the F-Class category. Telescopic sights may be used for all stages, and rests and sandbags will be allowed. Please contact the match director if you have questions.

Course of fire - Match will be conducted at 50 and 100 yards. Match is one-hundred twenty (120) shots for record. Time is 20 minutes per target card (20 shots), including unlimited sighters during that period.

Stage 1 - 40 record shots, 50yds, iron sights

Stage 2 - 40 record shots, 100yds, iron sights

Stage 3 - 20 record shots, 100yds, any sights + 20 record shots, 50yds, any sights (Dewar)

Awards – No awards will be given.
